In 2020, in EU, on average, 17.1% of households are overcrowded, according to Eurostat. Montenegro has the highest percentage of overcrowded houses, at 63%. Eurostat classifies a household as overcrowded if there aren't enough rooms for people to live comfortably. For instance, if there isn't a minimum of one room in the household per couple, or for each single person aged 18 and over. Cyprus boasts the lowest percentage of overcrowded households, at 2.2%.

among the EU Member States, almost half the population in Romania (45.1%) were living in overcrowded households in 2020. This was also the case for around two in every five persons in Latvia (42.5%), Bulgaria (39.5%), Poland (26.9%) and Croatia (26.2%). At the opposite end of the scale, the lowest overcrowding rates were recorded in Cyprus (2.2%), Malta (0.2%),
